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WO 13/001 - Musters of the Everyshire Militia, 1781-82 Introduction

The Militia Act of 1757 provided for men to serve in the militia at home in order to counter any threat arising when the majority of the regular army was stationed abroad. Lists of eligible men in each parish were known as militia ballot lists and from these, the men actually chosen appeared in the *militia lists* which are often to be found in county record offices. At the Public Record Office, however, are to be found the Muster and Pay Lists (class WO 13) and enrolment lists (WO 68). The initial lettercode of the PRO piece number relates to the department in which the document originated (here the War Office). The first number indicates the class, which is a collection of documents of the same type. After the oblique stroke (slash), the other number refers to the actual document within the class. The full reference is required if you wish to order this particular item to be seen at Kew.

The Pay Lists were kept when the Militia was embodied, ie at times of war. Thus, they can be found for 1781-82, the latter stages of the American War of Independence, when France and Spain declared war on Britain. The Militia was disembodied in 1783 and the Pay Lists were no longer maintained. The records start again during the French Wars, some from 1793 and others from as late as 1804.

The Militia was funded from the Land Tax so there are some references to it in PRO Class E 182. The men received Marching Money whilst embodied for the period 1780-83 and there were expenses paid for local meetings.

A sample has been taken of four counties from E 182 and the information found to be variable. Somerset lists the names of the men and where they enlisted. Cornwall only names the officers. Buckinghamshire names the officers and non-commissioned officers. Cambridgeshire has a mixture.

There were nine Companies of the Everyshire Militia commanded by the following:

A few men transferred between Companies and this was clearly stated on the documents. A larger number of men seems to disappear from one Company then appear in the Muster of another. Most of these have been identified and the second entry eliminated. A small number of men disappeared from the Muster with no indication of their fate. In these cases, there is an X in the Muster column. A couple of men were discharged and possibly re-enlisted later but there is a gap of some months in their service. As they cannot be confirmed as the same men, both entries have been left in.

In this document there are the records of four Musters:

1) All Companies met at Danbury Camp on 14 August 1781 and recorded service from 25 December 1780 to 24 June 1781.

All Musters were signed by Theodore Maurice, Commissary Musters and J Godbalve Crosse of Essex.

2) This Muster was held at Ware on 02 March 1782 and at Hertford on 19 April 1782 and recorded service from 25 June to 24 December 1781.

Colonel Salisbury's, Captain Fairford's, Captain Garrard's and Captain Houblon's Companies met at Hertford.

Lt Colonel Chase's, Major Houblon's, Captain Heath's, Captain Taylor's and Captain Wortham's Companies met at Ware.

All Musters were signed by Theodore Maurice, Commissary Musters and H Dunster JP at Hertford.

4) This Muster was held at a variety of places from 06 to 08 February 1783 and recorded service from 25 June to 24 December 1782.

Colonel Salisbury's, Lt Colonel Chase's, Captain Fairford's and Captain Heath's Companies met at Hertford on 07 February 1783.

Major Houblon's and Captain Houblon's Companies met at Bishop Stortford on 07 February 1783.

Captain Garrard's and Captain Wortham's Companies met at Hatfield on 06 February 1783.

Captain Taylor's Company met at Hoddisdon on 06 February 1783.

All Musters were signed by Theodore Maurice, Commissary Musters and H Dunster JP at Hertford.

In addition, Major Houblon's and Captain Houblon's Musters were signed by Matthew Law, Constable and Captain Taylor's Muster was signed by William Ashford, Constable.

Content

Rank may be abbreviated to Pte (Private), Cpl (Corporal) or Sgt (Sergeant).

For each man, it is recorded in which of the three or four musters the man appears, with some indication of transfers, discharges and other reasons for non-appearance.

Some men have aliases. These are noted as "aka" under "remarks" and a separate entry is made, listed under the alias. A few are recorded with forenames differing between musters; these are noted under "remarks" but there is no extra entry.
